Important Deadlines

While specific program deadlines may vary, the general application closing dates for international applicants living abroad are as follows:

Undergraduate Programs	Spring 26	October 1

 Scholarship Deadline: Applicants interested in the #YouAreWelcomeHere scholarship must submit their application (including an essay or video) by February 1 for the first-year international student cohort.

Note: All dates are for applicants residing abroad. Students must confirm the test score minimums and meet the specific intake deadlines. Always consult the official university website for the most accurate and up-to-date information.

Admission Requirements Reference

General Application Requirements

Applicants must complete the online application through the Rutgers portal. The application process is streamlined through the Shorelight portal, which pre-checks materials before forwarding them to Rutgers-Camden.

- **Application Fee**: A non-refundable \$70 application fee is required and is payable online with the application. Application Fee: Waived with waiver code "RUCSL"
- Core Documents: Official secondary/post-secondary transcripts (plus English translations if necessary), high school diploma/final transcript (or in-progress reports), and a passport photo page.
- Financial Documents: Proof of funds, such as a bank statement, must be submitted to facilitate the I-20 request if admitted.
- Optional: Submission of a resume/CV is optional but helpful. Credential evaluation (NACES/WES) is also optional for those seeking transfer credit or enhanced scholarship review.
- **Tracking**: Applicants should use their CommunityID in the Rutgers applicant portal to track their status after initial submission.

English Proficiency Requirements

Rutgers-Camden requires evidence of English proficiency through standardized testing. Scores must meet or exceed the following minimums:

TOEFL iBT 79 / IELTS 6.0 / Duolingo 115 / PTE 53 / Cambridge B2 / SAT 550 / ACT 21 / IB 4+

Estimated Annual Cost /

The estimated total annual cost for an undergraduate student at Rutgers University–Camden is **\$41,085**. This comprehensive estimate is broken down as follows:

• Tuition and Fees: \$31,985 • Room and Board: \$9,100

(All cost figures are estimates for the academic year and are subject to change by the university. The availability of scholarships and grants can significantly impact the net cost.)



The Two-Step Application Guidance

The application process is initiated through the Shorelight Admissions Portal and completed via the university's own system. For the South Asia Region (India, Pakistan, and the rest of the South Asia countries), applicants should submit the official application through the University application platform, then be redirected to the Shorelight Admissions Portal for record.

South Asia Region

STEP 1 Submit Documents to University Application Portal

- 1. Please apply through Rutgers University Admissions Portal (https://rutgers.my.site.com/ApplicantPortal/AppPortalCustom) before the Submission on Shorelight Admis-sions Portal. Then the applicant should pay the non-refundable \$70 application fee (Application Fee Waived with waiver code "RUCSL").
- 2. Once admitted, the applicant must pay the enrollment deposit and submit final financial documents tolnitiate the request for their I-20 form.
- 3. Students should use the official Rutgers applicant portal (Community ID) to closely monitor their statusand complete any outstanding requirements.

STEP 2 | Submit Documents via Shorelight Admissions Portal

- 2.Apply via the Shorelight "Apply" portal (https://portal.shorelight.com/login), selecting Undergraduate and Rutgers-Camden.
